## **How Can I Apply for a Status Card?**

\*\*Before applying, please make sure that all children or adults are already registered under the Indian Act\*\*

## If applying by mail, you must provide:

- 1. a completed Secure Certificate of Indian Status (SCIS) Application for Already Registered Persons (form 83-172)
- 2. photos that meet the photo requirements

## What is considered an acceptable photo?

If you are applying for a secure status card or need to renew or replace one, you must submit acceptable photos.

Acceptable photos can be in color or black and white and can be taken by anyone but must be:

- clear, sharp and in focus
- taken with a neutral facial expression, that is, eyes open and clearly visible, mouth closed
- taken with uniform lighting, without shadows, glare or flash reflections
- · taken straight on, with face and shoulders centered and squared to the camera
- taken in front of a plain white or light-colored background, with a clear difference between the face and the background
- must represent natural skin tones
- must be originals and not taken from an existing photo
- taken within the 12 months and reflect applicant's current appearance
- Also:
- prescription eyeglasses may be worn as long as the eyes are clearly visible and there is no reflection or glare on the eyeglasses
- sunglasses and tinted eyeglasses are unacceptable
- photos with the red-eye effect or red-eye alterations are unacceptable
- · head coverings are not acceptable, unless worn for religious beliefs or medical reasons:
- the full face must be clearly visible and the head covering must not cast any shadows on the face
- · hair can be worn down

## 3. photocopies of the front and back of original acceptable valid identification, each photocopy signed by a guarantor

### What is considered an acceptable valid identity document?

The identity document must have been issued by a federal, provincial, territorial or state government authority and must be valid (not expired).

To be considered acceptable, the valid identity document must include your:

- 1. name
- 2. date of birth
- 3. photo
- 4. signature


### Which forms of valid identification are acceptable?

Acceptable valid identification includes:

- passport (an international passport is acceptable if it includes the name, date of birth, photo and signature of the applicant and is accompanied by a professionally translated version if not in French or English)
- driver's license
- enhanced driver's license
- Canadian military identification card
- government-issued identification card
- government-issued enhanced identification card
- health card
- Canadian citizenship card (issued before February 1, 2012)
- Canadian permanent resident card
- U.S. permanent resident card (green card)

Original documents or photocopies are accepted. Photocopies must be of the front and back of the document, signed and dated by a guarantor and accompanied by a guarantor declaration (form 83-169).

Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) makes every possible effort to return original documents within one month after receiving an application.

## REGISTRATION AND SECURE CERTIFICATE OF INDIAN STATUS (SCIS) GUARANTOR DECLARATION

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

A guarantor is a person who can confirm the identity of the applicant.

Family members may act as guarantors only if they meet all the criteria listed below.

A parent or legal guardian applying for registration or for the Secure Certificate of Indian Status (SCIS) on behalf of a child or dependent adult cannot act as guarantor for the child or dependent adult.

The guarantor must perform the following tasks, as needed, free of charge:

- Complete and sign the Guarantor Declaration form.
- Sign and date the photocopies of the front and back of the applicant's identity documents.
- Sign and date the back of one (1) of the applicant's Canadian passport-style photographs, and write the following statement: "This is a true likeness of (name of applicant or child or dependent adult)."

#### **CRITERIA**

#### The guarantor:

- Must be 18 years of age or older.
- · Must reside in Canada or the United States.
- · Must be reachable for verification by the Department.
- Must have known the applicant personally for at least two (2) years.

Note: To know the applicant personally means that the guarantor is able to confirm information about the applicant, such as the name, approximate age, place of birth, physical description and some personal history such as place of residence.

#### The guarantor must be someone from the following list:

- Holder of a valid SCIS (who was 16 years of age or older when he/she applied for the card)
- Indian Registrar or Deputy Registrar
- Elected or appointed official (Band chief or councillor, Indian registration administrator, mayor, member of Parliament/Legislative Assembly)
- Medical professional (dentist, medical doctor, optometrist, pharmacist, chiropractor or registered nurse)
- Judge, magistrate or police officer (First Nations; RCMP; municipal, provincial, territorial police)
- Lawyer, notary public
- Minister of religion
- Postmaster/postmistress
- Senior university/college/school administration official and professor/teacher
- Professional accountant
- Professional engineer
- Registered social worker or social service worker
- Military personnel (only for Regular Force members and their dependents)
- Other occupations: visit www.canada.ca/indian-status for a more detailed list.

If an eligible guarantor is not available, the applicant must complete the Registration and Secure Certificate of Indian Status Statutory Declaration in Lieu of Guarantor (form 83-170E), and provide two (2) references who are not relatives

#### The references:

- · Must be 18 years of age or older.
- Must reside in Canada or the United States.
- Must be reachable for verification by the Department.
- Must have known the applicant personally for at least two (2) years.

Note: The Statutory Declaration in Lieu of Guarantor (form 83-170E) must be completed and signed before a Commissioner for Oaths, notary public or lawyer.
