POSITION SUMMARY:

Siksika Support Centre provides support for families, individuals, transgender, two spirited people experiencing domestic violence. - Work collaboratively within a multidisciplinary team within Siksika Support Centre, True North, Team Lead and treaty 7 area. RCMP, children services and with other community agencies within the town of Strathmore.
- Engage, collaborate and build a relationship with Treaty 7 area and surrounding communities.
- Increase awareness of Siksika Support Centre on the services that the support centre provides.
