POSITION SUMMARY:

Environment Technician One will conduct a field encumbrance review focusing on environmental and water management protection measures for land use requests and activities. Focus on plants, wetlands, wildlife, environmental assessments, soil classification, detailed site assessment reports and other related activities. Assist in the development, execution and maintenance of an Environmental Management Plan, Waste Management Plan, Water, and/or Riparian Plan.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Conduct compliance inspections of residential, construction, agricultural, industrial, grazing and resource-related activities in accordance with land use agreements and applicable environmental laws, regulations, guidelines, and/or bylaws.
- Assess proposed land use interest from Siksika members, various departments and entities, companies and contractors to ensure environmental protection practices including but not limited to, traditional ecological knowledge (TEK) and protection of Siksika environment and cultural/ historical sites are addressed, assist in identifying and correcting environment noncompliance in regard to land water and/or resource sites and activities.
- Identify plant, invasive species, wildlife, wetland identification and soil classification.
- Identify historical and current environment non-compliance sites and provide remediation measures.
- Submit field inspection reports, progress reports, briefing notes, and other ad hoc reports.
- Support in conducting Phase 1 and 2 ESA.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:
