## **POSITION SUMMARY:**

The Mental Health Support Worker position works with Siksika Nation members who need support and access to mental health services and other resources available in the community. They will work collaboratively with the Healing Support Program Team. The successful candidate will connect Nation members to various supports to improve overall wellbeing and assist members in navigating community resources.

Under the supervision of the Healing Support Program Supervisor, the Mental Health Support Worker will be responsible for facilitating referrals and case management. This includes mental health and overall wellness outreach to our Nation members. They will be part of a collaborative team offering an integrated support model of services.

## **DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES: *Duties include but are not limited to:***

1. Provide case management support: Assessments, intakes, follow-ups, referrals, and case note documentation.
2. Maintain member confidentiality in accordance with various legislations.
3. Complete all documentation according to standards established by Siksika Support Services.
4. Provide short-term individualized interventions and supports.
5. Determine appropriate wellness plans for members accessing programming.
6. Establish positive relationships with other team members, supervisors, and community professionals to develop and administer wellness plans.

## **MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Required Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities**

- Experience working in a similar role is considered an asset.
- Experience working with Indigenous communities is considered an asset.
- Strong understanding of mental health conditions, therapeutic techniques, and trauma-informed care
- Excellent communication, interpersonal, and documentation skills
- Ability to work independently and as part of a multidisciplinary team.
